Naming of OP Buildings (x4), Feb 2020

Tahu Pōtiki, Khyla Russell and Simon Kaan were instrumental in coming up with the theme of 'He Ara Honohono', intersecting pathways, to guide Otago Polytechnic's campus developments approximately four years ago. In the search for suitable names for the four buildings Council would now like named (i.e. G Block, H Block, O Block and S Block), this theme will be expanded upon, connecting with the history of the Otago region and linking with other work occurring more broadly across Dunedin City.

Led by Megan Pōtiki, a small group met at Ōtākou Marae on 18 February to discuss this concept further; the idea of using local waterways was decided upon (i.e. pathways via water, in alignment with 'He Ara Honohono'). Megan conducted further research and consulted on four preferred names with a broader group of mana whenua steeped in local history.

The names of the four buildings recommended by mana whenua to Council are:

1. H Block - Ōtākou

Otago Polytechnic is on the doorstep of the Ōtākou highway (i.e. Te Awa Ōtākou/the Otago Harbour), from which particular awa (streams/rivers) flow into the Taiari and further afield¹.

2. **G Block – Kaikarae**

Kai karae (as written by HK Taiaroa in his 1880 manuscript), now known as Kaikorai².

3. O Block - Ōwheo

Ōwheo is the stream beside O Block that runs in to the Ōtākou Harbour. There is little information about it orally, but there is valid information on this printed last century³.

4. S Block – Tauraka Pipipi

Tauraka Pipipi (as written by HK Taiaroa in his 1880 manuscript) is not actually a waterway, but an estuary – now known as Logan Park, on the corner of which S Block is located⁴.

 $^{^2}$ Kaikarae was also a river that flowed into the Ōtākou Harbour. It is currently being restored and would be a significant statement to name a building after the correct name: Kaikarae.

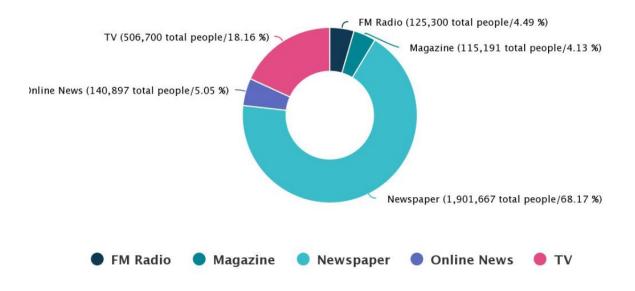

⁴ Tahu Pōtiki wrote that, the trails that Māori followed from Ōtākou to Taiari generally followed the coastline. Tauraka Pipipi was an estuary immediatly on the coastline that was then followed further afield, sometimes over the hills or on to another river (also recorded in the Taylor Manuscript).

Staff Development Day 30 January 2020

Theme is "Creating our future to create your future".

Preparation for change on top of workload can be stressful; we will look at how to support staff through this.

This Staff Development Day will also provide an update on NZIST.

4. MS Teams Meeting Management System (Jono Aldridge and Kathryn van Beek)

Jono and Kathryn demonstrated the new MS Teams site for Staff Subcommittee of Council, to replace our Insite page. Meeting agenda and minutes can be found here.

5. Employee Assistance Programme (Laura Warren)

An update from Laura on changes to the EAP.

Previously OP has had an arrangement with a number of local providers for counselling, and invoices come back with staff identifying details. This system also did not allow for benchmarking in the sector etc. Laura noted that it is common for large institutions to use one large provider for such services.

With this in mind OP has contracted Benestar to provide EAP. HR receives a report at DCE level covering themes but with no names. This will allow good reporting and identification of common themes across the sector with other organisations using the same system. Data on presenting issues is de-personalised which ensures confidentiality.

Staff need to be made aware of the changes; not everyone has seen the notices on Tuhono.

Action

Kathryn will create a digital screen.

Pulse Check

Laura outlined the main topics and feedback from the recent Pulse Survey. What staff want from formal leaders – 'transparent communication' was high on the list.

Next year People and Culture will focus on reviewing and improving induction processes. The Staff Capability Framework will also be rolled out along with AIC's "lamCapable" tool.

Leading for the Future programme lead by Pleasance Hansen has been piloted, final session today. Participant feedback will be sought and a decision made on whether to continue it next year.

P&C will also focus on the competency framework, holistic wellbeing, issues that have arisen for staff as a result of RoVE, managing change.
