Our bridging to beauty certificate, the <u>New Zealand Certificate in Study and Career</u> <u>Preparation (Level 3)</u> provides the perfect pathway into this Level 4 programme.

Entry requirements

- You must be at least 18 years old by the time the programme ends in November.
- Applicants under 20 must have:
 - <u>New Zealand Certificate in Study and Career Preparation (Level 3) Beauty</u> <u>context</u> OR
 - NCEA Level 2 (English and Science credits preferred) OR
 - $\circ~$ New Zealand Certificate in Makeup and Skin Care (Introduction) (Level 3),
 - OR equivalent.
- In exceptional circumstances, applicants under 20 who do not meet the academic entry requirements may be granted entry to the programme.
- There are no minimum entry requirements for those over 20.
- If English is not your first language, you must provide:
 - New Zealand University Entrance OR
 - Overall Academic IELTS 5.5 with no individual band score lower than 5.0 (achieved in one test completed in the last two years), OR
 - Acceptable alternative evidence of the required IELTS (<u>see here for NZQA</u> proficiency table and <u>here for list of recognised proficiency tests</u>).

If you need to improve your English Language skills, we offer a <u>wide range of English</u> <u>programmes</u>.

If you don't have the entry requirements above, talk to us about whether you have the equivalent skills and knowledge or to determine if this is the right programme for you.

Please note: this programme is subject to minimum numbers.

Additional documentation

You must supply your academic records, along with certified copies of proof of identity and proof of residency (where appropriate).
