If you're passionate about design, media, and/or art and want to gain foundational digital media and design skills for work or further study, this may be the programme for you! It'll help develop the foundational knowledge and skills you need to use current digital technology to express yourself and impress future clients.

You'll use a variety of tools and technologies, including the Adobe suite, to explore your creative interests, build a portfolio, and add to your digital toolkit as you design and create digital media with the 'wow' factor.

You'll develop your understanding of many aspects of digital design, including design principles, design elements, animation, photography, HTML design elements, creating an engaging user interface experience, developing effective content, digital citizenship, symbols, motif, and mark-making.

Graduates of this qualification will have the knowledge and skills to fill assistant and/or support roles in various industries. These areas might include advertising, web design, in-house design studio and news media.

What will I learn?

Become a problem-solver

This programme will help you develop your problem-solving skills in a digital media and design context. You'll learn how to select and use tools and design principles to turn design problems into design solutions.

Use project briefs to apply and manage a design process

You'll learn how to apply and manage the design process, paying attention to key concerns such as safe work practice.

Apply fundamental skills in digital media and design to project briefs

You'll learn how to use a range of digital tools as you follow the design process and turn project briefs into designs, gaining practical experience along the way.

Define your own digital media and design work in a range of contexts...

...and gain experiences working collaboratively in a team and critiquing your own work and the work of others.

Learn how to be a good digital citizen and consider your career or study pathway in the digital media and design industry.

Learn the fundamentals of digital citizenship in New Zealand's unique context, including ethical and legal responsibilities regarding intellectual property, the Copyright Act, the Privacy Act, and honouring the Treaty of Waitangi. Learn about and reflect on your future in the digital media and design industry.

How will I learn?

Your learning will be delivered fully online via the eCampus NZ portal. You'll be supported through your learning journey by eCampus NZ online facilitators and student advisors, and you'll also have access to your enrolling institute's on-campus services, including their libraries and support services.

One of the great things about completing online study with eCampus NZ is the flexible nature of the course timetable, with most courses available to start at regular intervals throughout the year. There are both full-time and part-time options available.

Entry requirements

Academic requirements

- 10 NCEA Level 1 literacy credits or the New Zealand Certificate in Creativity (Level 4), or equivalent.

Alternative Requirements

Applicants who are unable to evidence that they meet Academic Entry Requirements, but who can demonstrate acquired skills for tertiary study gained through study, work and/or life experience, may be approved for alternative entry.

Additional Requirements

Portfolio: Applicants may be required to submit a portfolio demonstrating their digital media/design work.

Interview: Applicants may be required to attend an interview.

Experience

Even if you don't have the necessary qualifications, you may still be approved for entry if you can show you have the literacy and numeracy skills needed for tertiary study through other study, work and/or life experience. Please contact us for more information.

Language

- If English is not your first language, you may be required to show that your English language skills meet IELTS 5.5 Academic (no lower than 5.0 in any subtest) or English Proficiency Outcomes Chart equivalent.
- If you have no evidence of your English language skills and are a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, contact us for an assessment.
- Students with NCEA Level 3 University Entrance are not required to provide evidence of English Language Skills.

Software requirements

How long will it take?

This qualification is made up of four courses. Each course is delivered over 10 weeks and is worth 15 credits.

NZQA guidelines suggest up to 150 hours of total study time for a 15-credit course. To complete one of the courses successfully in the 10-week timeframe, you must be prepared to devote approximately 15 hours per week to your study.

Depending on your previous academic online experience and course level, the time commitment may vary.

If you want to study as a full-time student, you can enrol in more than one course at a time, which will increase the amount of study required per week.
